AUSCA SPIRIT, AUSCA SPIRIT, WHEREFORE ART THOU AUSCA SPIRIT???

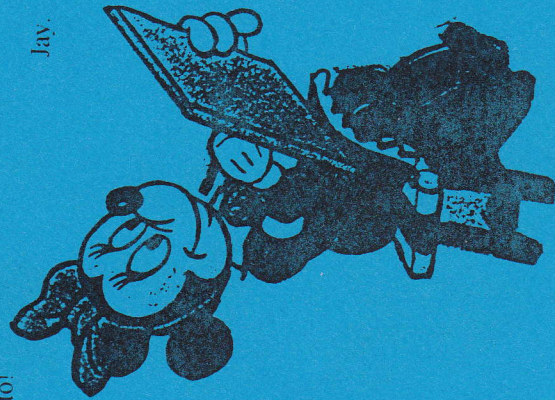
I think this is one question that's been on everyone's lips this year. Where are the AUSCA folk? You! Yes you know who you are, where have you been?

Fifty AUScA people in pyjama's, the majority of whom were (of course) drinking and we didn't ruin anything! I for one am impressed.

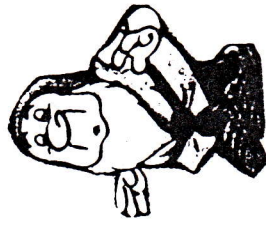
The pyjongatail party that took place on the 5th of June was a huge success and was thoroughly enjoyed by all (well at least most) who attended.

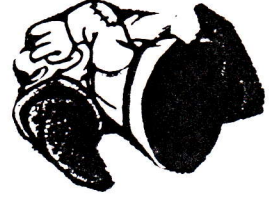
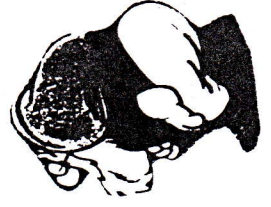
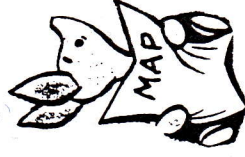
