## PISCES- (February 20 -March 20)

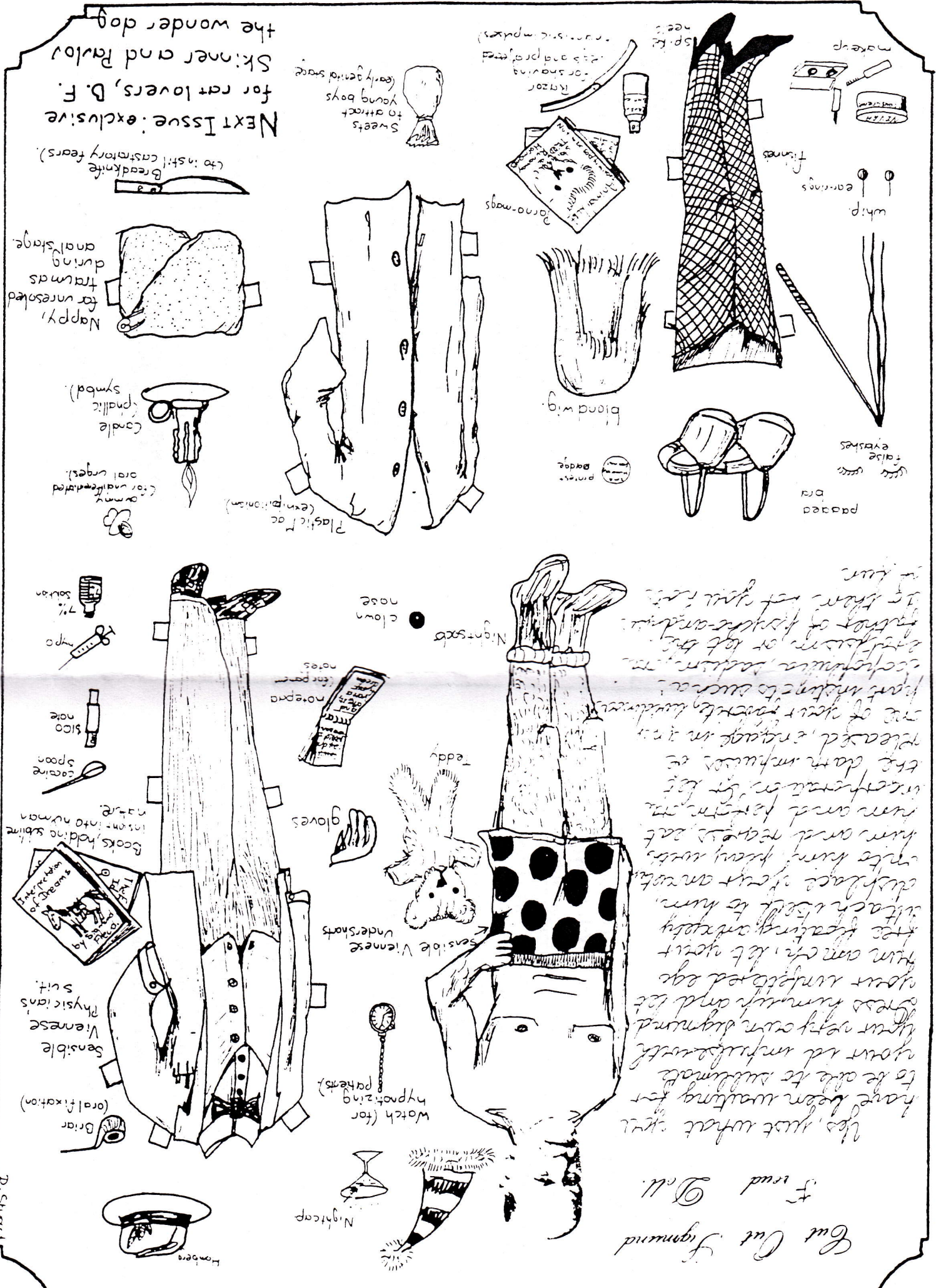

And guys..... You can leave your hats on!!!!

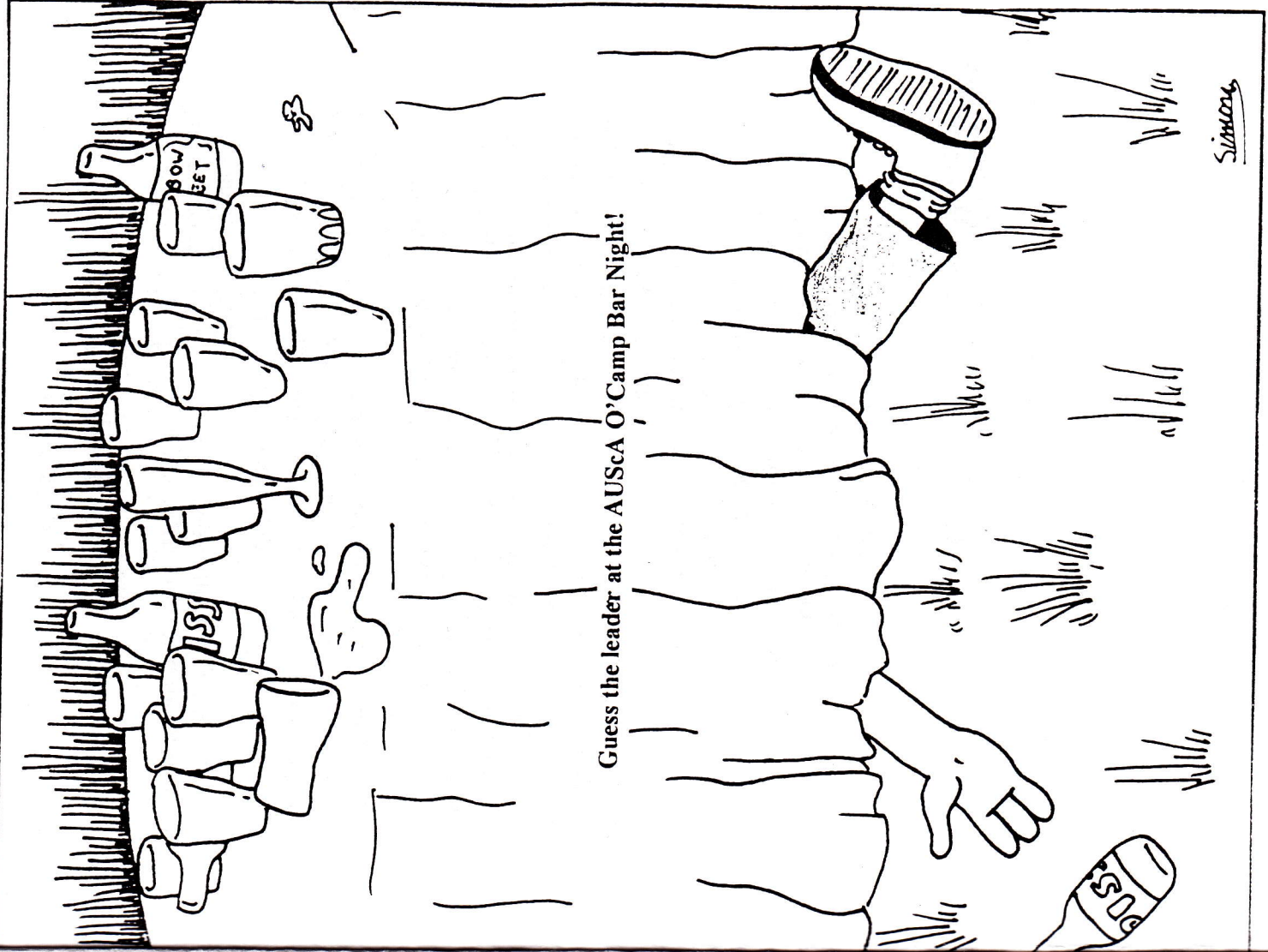
