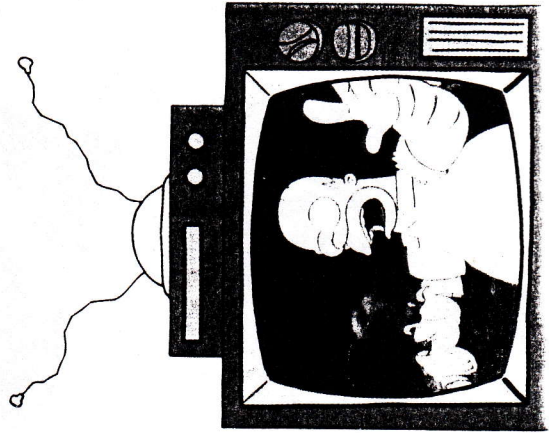


MD&A 2000 Reorientation Camp

Prosh Report

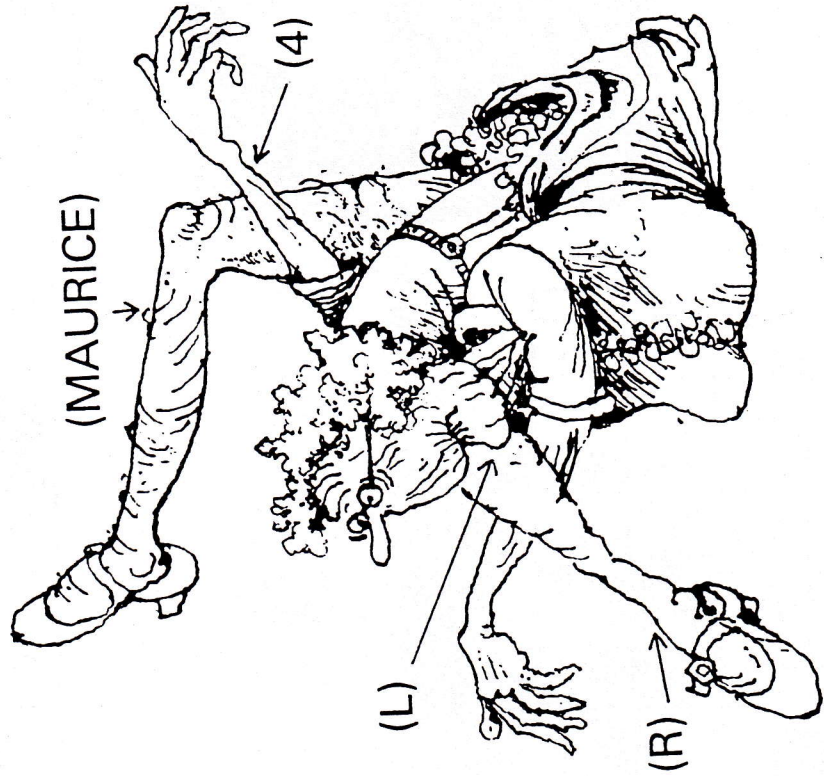

The afternoon was also productive with Gavin, Michelle, and Kym taking the "Woolworths man" hostage. The stunt raised little money but was highly amusing to watch.

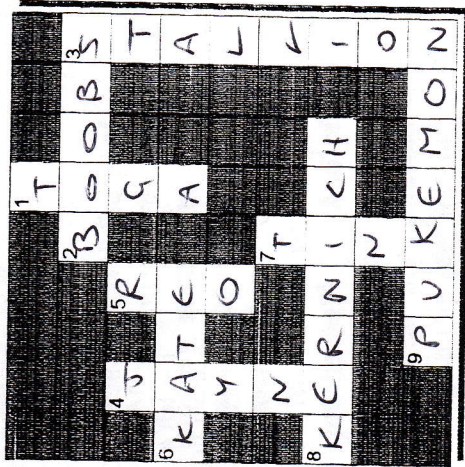

Pukemon Report.

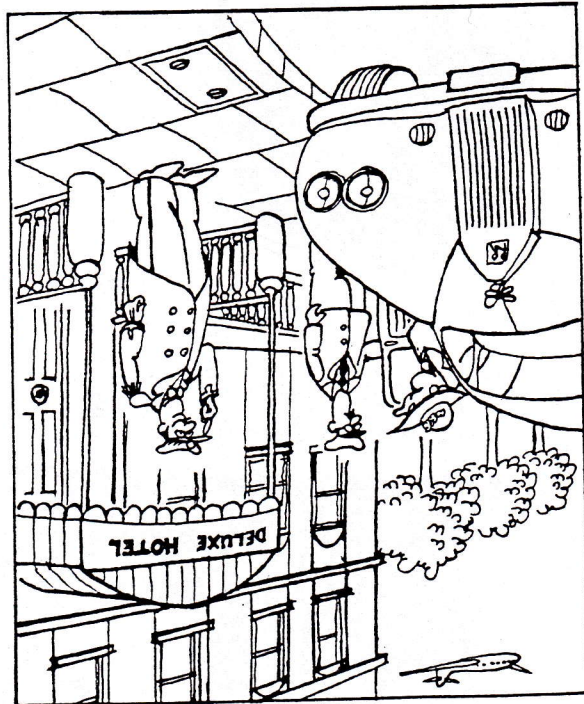
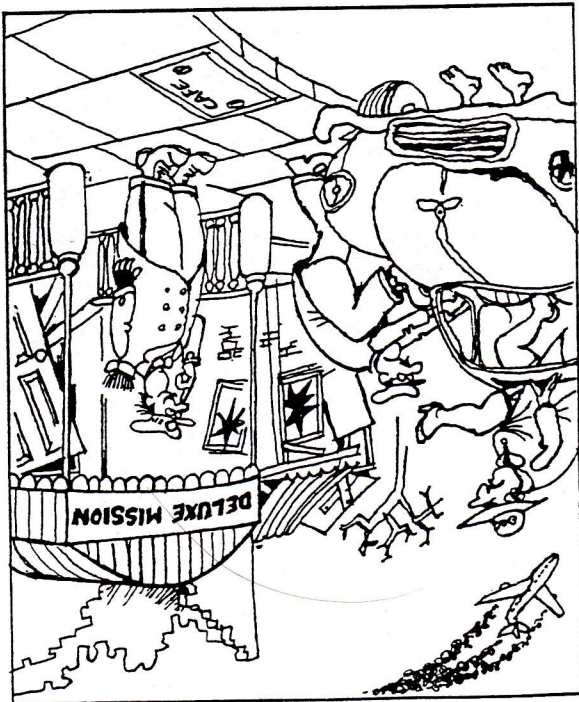
